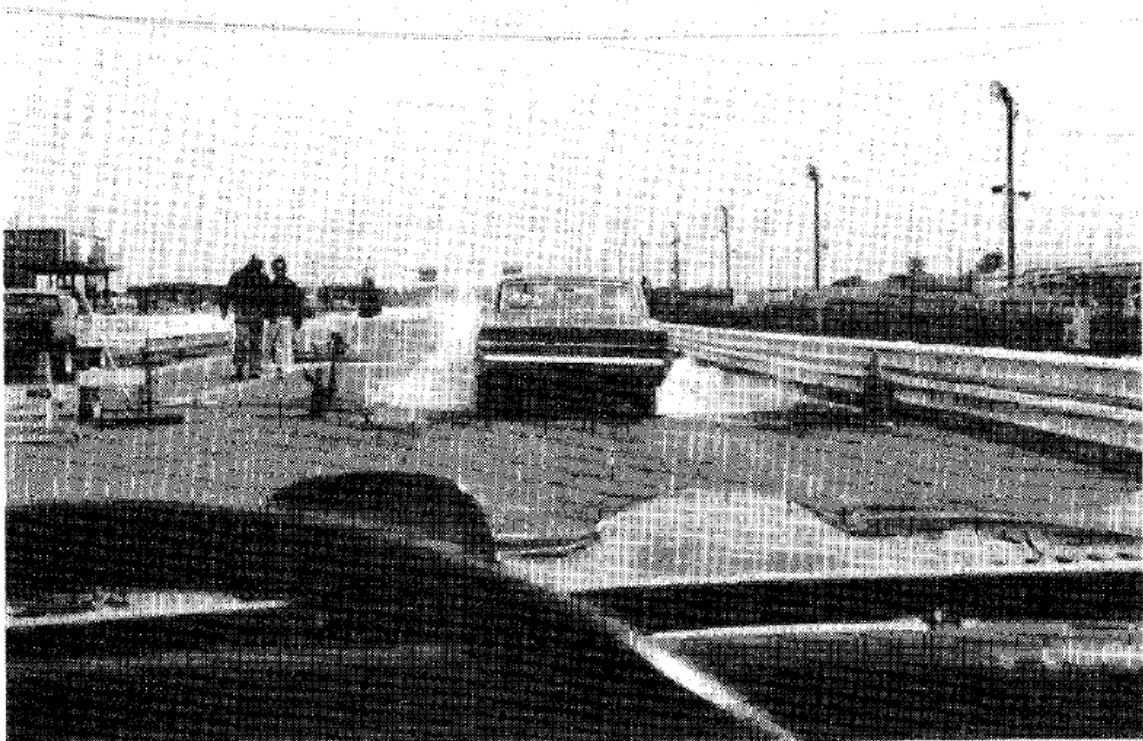
Our 1965 GTO Hardtop is Earl's second GTO. Earl bought his first one, a 1965 GTO Sports Coupe, in 1971. It was light blue with a 389, 4 bbl and a four speed and no options, a real race machine.

In 1984, we decided to find another 1965 GTO. The search took about a year. The hardtop was found and purchased in Southern Illinois and then towed home with clutch problems and the drivers door in the trunk.

Then the search was on for the parts needed to restore the rusty old Goat. After the necessary parts were located, about a year was spent doing the frame off restoration at Fenton Auto Body.

The car was finished just in time for the 1987 Easter Car Show in Forest Park. Later in 1987, during a stop in Michigan on the way to the GTOAA Nationals in Ohio, the front end of the '65 was wrecked. What a disappointment for the car's first national event!

I enjoy racing, so we removed the four speed and installed an automatic to go with the '71 400 4bbl (Tri-power on the way) and 3.23 posi. The car runs 14.0 second quarter miles at 92 mph. The family enjoys the car for cruising around, racing and shows.
