

There were with 20 members in attendance. Me	feeting was adjourned at 8:50 P.M.
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
## OCTOBER/NOVEMBER 1992 GOAT OF THE MONTH By Greg Tombridge


I have always had a love for old cars, street rods and street machines. After looking for some time in the car trader magazines and newspapers, I saw a red 1965 GTO for sale. My son, Paul, and I went and looked it over. The car had a good outward overall appearance. The owner received many inquiring calls while we were looking it over. We were the first to look at it. I test drove it and we cut a deal.

Once I started working on my car, it kind of snow-balled. The more improvements I made on it (with the help of my friends) the more I wanted to work on it. My dream was becoming reality before my eyes.

One day my good friend Steve Morley, who has helped me make a lot of improvements over the years, suggested that I should enter a small car show along with himself and Earl Chapman. I said, "My car is not good enough to compete." After some convincing by Steve and Earl, I went to my first car show. To my surprise, I took a second place in my class and was forever hooked.

I have been doing what I would call a frame-up restoration over the last six years and making improvements on just about every part of my GTO.





I started making improvements from the time I bought my GTO. I enjoy working on the car myself, but I also have had the help of knowledgeable friends. The changes include rebuilding the ten bolt posi rear end and many changes in the engine compartment such as custom wiring including (HEI) electronic ignition from a Pontiac Trans Am. Also included are several high performance improvements on the 400 cu.in, motor and a lot of chrome and detailing in the engine compartment. The clutch linkage had to be modified and rebuilt to work with the exhaust headers. I have replaced many of the front end parts with new parts. Everything under the car has been painted or undercoated by myself, after many hours on my back. The interior also has many new parts. These include the steering wheel, woodgrain dash, arm rests, headliner and carpet and the seats have been repaired and repadded. I added seat belts and a stereo system. The Hurst linkage was sent to Hurst and rebuilt. I had the drive shaft balanced at Mid-West Four Wheel Drive Company. I sanded and repainted the trunk trying to put it back to stock condition. After a couple of years and some trouble with the paint in the trunk cracking, I decided to have Kevin and Lee Keehn cover the trunk and spare tire with a custom auto interior of a dove gray material.

Some paint and body work was done by Suburban Auto Body and new weather stripping and glass run doorstops were added. I replaced or detailed the body emblems. I took all the rear chrome molding, tail light bezels, rear bumper, aerial, hood latches, hood hinges, springs and many motor parts to Nolan Portenberry in South County and had them chromed or rechromed.

I plan on keeping my GTO for a long time. I have more improvements planned for the future. The best is yet to come.

Saturday, September 26th was to be the first day of the two day show at Gateway International Raceway but the day's events were canceled because of threatening weather and a wet race track. Sunday more than made up for the cancellation with beautiful weather and great show cars and racing.

There were 115 show cars registered to be judged and 35 cars for display only. Out of the nine GGTOA cars entered in the car show, seven took home trophies. In the 64-67 GTO Stock class Darrell Carnal's 67 took first place and Brad Piper's 66 tied for third. John Novelli's 70 Judge won first in the 68-74 class. Gateway GTO cars swept the GTO/LeMans Modified class with Bob Swiecicki's 72 LeMans UFO taking first, Wayne Sommer's 67 Convertible coming second and Tony Bezzole's 70 and Cathey Pacelli's 67 tying for third.

The day was highlighted by some of the most exciting racing seen in this area in a long time. Scott Brohammer raced his 68 Convertible in the Top Eliminator class and ran consistent 10.70s all day. He took home \$100 for winning third place out of 132 cars.

Arnie "Farmer" Beswick and Team Tiger were at the show and made several exhibition runs. They had a very successful day. 
