to that Earl raised another \$495 doing 50/50, bringing his grand total for the event to an amazing \$2845!

The other big donation, of course, was the money we raised from the raffle. The final tally for that was \$772. Adding that to the till, the grand total raised by Gateway for the event was \$3617.

I don't yet have the overall totals for the event, but I do know from talking to Sharon Mercer that overall there were 141 cars that paid at the gate. While we would have liked that number to be higher, it is far better than the attendance we have had for this show in years.
