AGMO Saved my '55

Now that Pontiac has joined with GMC, I thought I'd relate a story about a GMC saving my 1958 Pontiac. In 1961 my father helped me get a 1958 Pontiac Superchief 2-door hardtop. It was all white with green on the top and in the spear and had a 370 cubic inch engine with a two-barrel. To a kid of 19, it felt like one of the hottest cars in town. HELL. I'd take on Ford 406's and chevy 409's - wouldn't beat them, but I'd still run them. Dad had Pontiacs since the early 40's and to me this '58 was the tops; Pontiac was ingrained into my brain. The early 60's were great; we cruised the streets of Peoria and dragged raced at the rev of an engine. Boy, did I put that car through its paces; and, it held up through it all. Tried putting on tri-power (never could work in carbs). Put in a 3/4 cam one time, but left the car running one afternoon in the drive to get a coat when I came back out my dad had the hood up trying to smooth out the engine - spent the next day taking out the cam. I don't think there was a part of the car I didn't take apart just to see what it did (carb had to

be put back together by someone else).

A year and a half later I find myself in the Air Force in Biloxi, Miss. I missed my Ponie and has to have it with me. I did a lot of talking to get my parents to tow it down to me, but I got it. Now the rest of the story.

One afternoon we are coming up with a three day weekend and wanted to do something. Some one said he was from Ft. Lauderdale, Florida and why don't we go there. He would introduce us to some girls, so off we go. About 450 miles from Biloxi at two-thirty in the morning I start hearing a ticking sound, then a loud bang from the engine with the grinding ofmetal parts. I left the Ponie in a wrecking yard with a note and started hitchhiking back to base. It took a couple of weeks to talk someone into taking me back with a tow-bar; a fellow Pontiac owner with a '57. While coming back we dressed up the '58 to look like a drag racer. numbers on the windshield, and convinced a hitchhiking marine that it was a very fast car.

With the car back on base we tore


down the engine and found a sliver from No. 2 rod bearing had broken off and locked up No. 1 rod, snapping the rod in half. No damage was done to the block. Had a hard time finding parts, on a Airman's wages. Finally ran across a short block taken from a 1957 GMC pick-up. The block was a 347 cu. in. But the crank was the same. The pistons were low compression so I had to find three others; with the 347 crank and three new pistons, my Ponie was going back together. Had a fellow Airman help me by the name of McKutchin. I think, he was from Washington or Oregon, gave a lot of help couldn't have done it without him. If some how he sees this, "Buddy I thank you." Ended up dragging it on the local drag strip by Biloxi and set a record for my class.

Don't think I'll ever forget that '58 Ponie. Meet my wife while I had the car and I think it's the only car I could bring home as a new project that I would not have to sleep in. Thanks for letting me relive this memory.




